## From the Pastor

We continue our study of the shortened form of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* called the *Compendium*. We are now in the section on the Seven Sacraments of the Church. This week we will look at the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Here are this week's three questions with the catechism's answer and my commentary.

**What is the name of this sacrament? It is called the sacrament of Penance, the sacrament of Reconciliation, the sacrament of Forgiveness, the sacrament of Confession, and the sacrament of Conversion.**

Commentary: The various names for the sacrament point to the different aspects of what the sacrament entails and what it effects. It is called the sacrament of Penance because it involves doing reparation for one's sins. It is called the sacrament of Reconciliation because its effect is to reconcile us with God and with the Church. It is called the sacrament of Forgiveness because it bestows forgiveness of sins. It is called the sacrament of Confession because it requires confession of one's sins to the Church's minister, the priest. It's called the sacrament of Conversion because it demands conversion of heart and helps further the process of conversion to Christ in the penitent's life.

**Why is there a sacrament of Reconciliation after Baptism? Since the new life of grace received in Baptism does not abolish the weakness of human nature nor the inclination to sin (that is, *concupiscense*), Christ instituted this sacrament for the conversion of the baptized who have been separated from him by sin.**

Commentary: As we saw when we were looking at the sacrament of Baptism, baptism makes one a new creation in Christ. As such, it frees one from all sin, both original sin (the state of being separated from communion with God) and any personal sins that one has repented of. But God allows the weakness that sin has caused to remain after Baptism, a weakness that the person must strive to overcome through the grace bestowed in Baptism and the other graces God gives after Baptism. God also allows a certain inclination to sin to remain after Baptism. The baptized person continues to find sin attractive but must struggle to overcome that attraction through a constant discipline of prayer, self-control, good works and frequent reception of the sacraments.

**When did he institute this sacrament? The risen Lord instituted this sacrament on the evening of Easter when he showed himself to his apostles and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained" (John 20:22-23).**

Commentary: Jesus associates the Church in his work of redemption. The grace of redemption, which alone comes from him, is mediated through the Church and her ministers. Thus, the forgiveness of sins which Jesus won for us on the Cross is mediated to sinners through the Church's sacraments. This is especially true of the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation which the Lord established to communicate forgiveness and reconciliation upon those who fall into sin after Baptism but who approach the Lord with a repentant heart.

For the next few weeks our parish Special Needs Ministry will be publishing articles from the resource, *Opening Doors of Welcome and Justice to Parishioners with Disabilities: A Parish Resource Guide*, a publication of the National Catholic Partnership on Disability (NACP) in Washington, DC. We hope you find these articles informative and helpful.

### **DEFINITION OF DISABILITY**

Disabilities are the normal and anticipated outcome of the risks, strains, and stresses of the living process itself. When we think of them this way, they cease to be individual tragedies and become an event to be expected within every family and community. Such limitations may occur early in life or in old age. They can result from alterations in an individual's gene code, in utero, during the birth process, or later in life.

Each person's journey toward disability is highly personal and unique, just as each of us is unique. Our vulnerability, which has been encoded into our gene pool, is the catalyst which brings us into community and church with renewed recognition that we need each other and our Lord.

It is our common recognition of that interdependency which weaves the threads of our societies together. There is wisdom in vulnerability, and it will bind us together powerfully, if we will only look at the reality with fresh vision. We must constantly remind ourselves that God's gift of life is placed in fragile earthen vessels to a powerful purpose. We have only to recognize and celebrate that reality, and it will free us from past fears.
