## From the Pastor

We continue our study of the shortened form of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* called the *Compendium*. We are now in the section on the Seven Sacraments of the Church. This week we will look at the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Here are this week's three questions with the catechism's answer and my commentary.

**Do the baptized have need of conversion? The call of Christ to conversion continues to resound in the lives of the baptized. Conversion is a continuing obligation for the whole Church. She is holy but includes sinners in her midst.**

Commentary: The first words spoken by our Lord in his public ministry were, "Repent and believe in the good news." The word our Lord uses for repent is *metanoiete*, which literally means "change your way of thinking." Throughout the entire course of our Christian life, Jesus calls us to conform our way of thinking and therefore our way of life to his way of thinking and acting. Any other way of thinking or acting misses the mark and is therefore sinful. We know from experience how resistant we can be at times to conforming ourselves to the person of Jesus. Until we are perfectly at one with him, there is always the need for conversion of mind and heart—a turning away from what is sinful to what is just and true.

**What is interior penance? It is the movement of a "contrite heart" (Psalm 51:17) drawn by divine grace to respond to the merciful love of God. This entails sorrow for and abhorrence of sins committed, a firm purpose not to sin again in the future and trust in the help of God. It is nourished by hope in divine mercy.**

Commentary: God awakens in us a sorrow and hatred for sin. Certainly, we can ignore or reject this grace whereby God shows us mercy, but if we allow his grace to work in our hearts then we can move forward with a firm purpose to reject sin in all its many forms and trust that God will always give us sufficient grace to carry out our purpose of amendment. The number of times we continually fall into sin, even the very sins we have repented of, should be met not with discouragement but with hope, that if we persevere in doing good with all our heart, soul and strength (see Deuteronomy 6:5), God will finally deliver us from every attachment to sin and establish us firmly in virtue. In becoming more and more detached from sin, we are more and more able to cling to "whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, [excellent], and worthy of praise" (Philippians 4:8).

**What forms does penance take in the Christian life? Penance can be expressed in many and various ways but above all in fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. These and many other forms of penance can be practiced in the daily life of a Christian, particularly during the time of Lent and on the penitential day of Friday.**

Commentary: "Doing penance" is first of all the cultivation of an interior attitude of love and surrender to God, which in turn is always a response to the holiness and love of God we encounter in Christ and our faith in him. It entails all the necessary efforts we must undertake to put to death every sinful inclination in our person, so that our whole being—spirit, soul and body—may be conformed to the Person of Christ. Among the works of penance that our Lord especially commanded and which he himself modeled for us are fasting, prayer and almsgiving. In addition, the virtue of penitence is exercised "in persevering faithfulness to the duties of one's state in life, in the acceptance of the difficulties arising from one's work and from human coexistence, in a patient bearing of the trials of earthly life and of the utter insecurity which pervades it" (St. Paul VI, *Apostolic Constitution on Penance*).
