

From the Pastor

We continue our study of the shortened form of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* called the *Compendium*. We are now in the section on the Seven Sacraments of the Church. This week we continue with our consideration of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Here are this week's three questions with the catechism's answer and my commentary.

When must one receive Holy Communion? The Church recommends that the faithful, if they have the required dispositions, receive Holy Communion whenever they participate at Holy Mass. However, the Church obliges them to receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season.

Commentary: The Eucharist is a sacrificial meal, a spiritual banquet that serves up the most exquisite food and drink: the Body and Blood of the Lord! One normally attends an earthly banquet in order to partake of the food and drink. And this is true of the Eucharist as well. Sometimes our stomach isn't feeling well, so we forgo eating and drinking until we feel better. If we are not feeling well spiritually when we come to Mass, if we lack the "required dispositions" of walking faithfully with Jesus in our daily life and not falling into serious sin, then we must first settle our "stomach" before receiving Holy Communion through a good confession of our sins lest we "vomit up" the food we have received and it do us no good.

What is required to receive Holy Communion? To receive Holy Communion one must be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church and be in the state of grace, that is, not conscious of being in mortal sin. Anyone who is conscious of having committed a grave sin must first receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before going to Communion. Also important for those receiving Holy Communion are a spirit of recollection and prayer, observance of the fast prescribed by the Church, and an appropriate disposition of the body (gesture and dress) as a sign of respect for Christ.

Commentary: In order to receive Holy Communion and so share in the paschal banquet, a person must already be in communion with Jesus as a believing and practicing Catholic. The Eucharist is not a stepping stone to communion with Jesus as some mistakenly believe. It is the strengthening of a communion that already exists. The Eucharist is the outward sign of the Church's unity. Therefore, only those who are Catholic and in the state of grace (meaning they have no serious sins on their conscience which they have not already confessed in the Sacrament of Reconciliation) may profitably and respectfully receive Holy Communion. Out of respect for the Eucharist, the Church requires that the faithful fast for at least an hour before receiving Communion and that when they receive Communion they do so in a spirit of prayerfulness.

What are the fruits of Holy Communion? Holy Communion increases our union with Christ and with his Church. It preserves and renews the life of grace received at Baptism and Confirmation and makes us grow in love for our neighbor. It strengthens us in charity, wipes away venial sins and preserves us from mortal sin in the future.

Commentary: Holy Communion is to the soul what an infusion of vitamins is to the body. It invigorates the soul and preserves it against spiritual disease. It enables the soul to function freely and apply itself effectively to the love of God and neighbor. It helps maintain a person in the state of grace, that they may rest in the peace of God undisturbed, even amidst many worldly trials, temptations and difficulties.

Special Needs Ministry --Helping those with disabilities and their families share in the fullness of our Catholic Faith and Community life.

The webinar sponsored by the Department of Special Needs Ministries of the Archdiocese of Washington provided some very helpful resources and tips for celebrating Advent, Christmas, and the New Year with children and adults who are living with disabilities. Of particular interest were the tips shared by two parents of children with disabilities. One of those parents is **our parish Parent Support Group facilitator, Donna Njoku**. Some of the tips they shared were: know your child and prepare him/her for any changes in their schedule; have an entrance strategy - review what to expect in terms of sounds, smells, visual details, and anything that may be out of the ordinary that may cause anxiety; have an exit strategy -know that it is ok to leave Mass early if needed; celebrate Christmas as you would a birthday, with cake and presents; remember that the more your child participates, the more they will be accepted by the community and the more they will feel welcome; and, finally, be relaxed - have fun and invent your own "perfect."
