THE STORY OF OUR REDEMPTION

We begin the final week of Lent with these familiar readings. This year, we hear the Passion from the Gospel of Luke. These readings for Palm Sunday and the Passion used to be read on successive Sundays. Now they are combined into a single feast, so that we may see the whole sweep of the glory and the suffering played out. Jesus accepts the adulation of the crowd, the foreshadowing of his glory in the Resurrection. He bids farewell to his disciples in his last Passover, and forgives his tormentors as he dies on the cross. Later this week, we enter the Holy Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, when the whole story of our redemption will play out once again.

From the Pastor

St. Paul describes the Christian life in these terms: "All of us, gazing on the Lord's glory with unveiled faces, are being transformed *from glory to glory* into his very image by the Lord who is the Spirit" (2 Corinthians 3:18).

We begin Holy Week, the most sacred days of the Church's liturgical calendar, by recalling Jesus' glorious entrance into Jerusalem when the crowds hailed him as Messiah and Lord. We conclude Holy Week by celebrating Jesus' glorious triumph over sin and death in the brilliant light of the Resurrection. We move with Jesus from glory to glory.

But, between these two glorious events there lies a profound mystery: our Lord's suffering and death. He spoke of it openly to his disciples, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem and everything written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled. He will be handed over to the Gentiles and he will be mocked and insulted and spat upon; and after they have scourged him they will kill him, but on the third day he will rise." (Luke 18:31-33)

Jesus' announcement of his impending suffering and death did not sit well with the apostles. At one point, Peter took Jesus aside and began to argue with him: "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." But our Lord strongly rebuked him, "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." (Matthew 16:22-23)

"Oh, how foolish you are!" Jesus said to the two disciples on the road to Emmaus after his Resurrection "How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" (Luke 24:25-26)

Our Lord was teaching them (and us) that it is the Way of the Cross that leads to the glory of Resurrection and eternal life.

In another place, he said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." (John 12:24)

And then, applying this mystery to his disciples, he added: "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be." (John 12:25-26)

As we follow the liturgies of this week, moving with Jesus from glory to glory, let us not despise the Cross but embrace it with unveiled faces, that is, with no illusions about what it cost our Lord and what it must cost us also if we are to be transformed into the image of Jesus by the Lord who is the Spirit and so attain to the glory of the Resurrection and eternal life.

P.S. I urge as many of our parishioners as possible to attend at least one if not all three of the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. Those who attend the Easter Vigil have fulfilled their Easter Sunday obligation. Our Easter Vigil this year will be especially joyful. Seven individuals who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil, three adults and four children. Two individuals baptized as Protestants will be coming into the full communion of the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. And two individuals who were baptized as Catholics and have completed the prescribed catechesis will complete their Christian initiation by receiving Confirmation and their First Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil. Please keep them in your prayers and, if possible, come to the Easter Vigil to celebrate the great outpouring of God's grace in the most solemn and beautiful of all the Church's liturgies.
